Who can apply?

To take part, you must:

- be a recently arrived humanitarian entrant living in Tasmania;
- be an Australian citizen or permanent resident;
- be available during normal business hours - 8.45am to 5.00pm from 30 November to 11 December 2009; and
- have good English language skills.
