
If so, what sort of timeframe will there be for a decision?

### Dear Mr Hodgman

I am writing to clarify the situation regarding access to surgical termination of pregnancy in Tasmania.

I understand you have stated your opposition to the delivery of the service within the public hospitals, despite the inequity of this decision. I believe you have stated private provision of services is a preference for your Government. This policy does not solve the access issue. The cost of private services is prohibitive. It also requires access to the information about the providers of those services; information which most providers to not want to make public.

It also doesn't take into account the fact the law allows self referral and yet the recommendation from your government is go to your GP. This would therefore require women to have the funds to pay for another appointment, since it is almost impossible to get a bulk billed appoint with a GP in Tasmania. There are also many GPs who have closed their books to new patients.

We have been working very cooperatively throughout January and into this month to

- Inform women there are options although limited; and
- Cooperate with your own office and various sections of DHHS to gather more detailed information on alternative strategies.

We have been selective in accepting media requests because we do not want to alarm women or cause the rise of the level of debate this topic arouses. We also believe what medical procedures a woman accesses should not be the topic for electioneering. However we have had to counter the statement which state or imply there are plenty of options for women. Options are limited and expensive.

Although we welcome the increased speed of processing patient transport, it is not the best option for most women. It is always difficult to undertake any surgical procedure even when you are close to family and supports. To send women interstate is unkind and expensive, when the service could easily be available in Tasmania. Transport costs do not cover all expenses associated with such a trip. Additionally it is still going to be covered by Tasmanians in the long run at a greater expense.

I would appreciate the opportunity to meet with you personally. I am interstate from today but available at any time of day next week.

This is not about supporting one side of politics it is about supporting women.


