## **FACT SHEET**

## Project Funded Under the 2020-21 CSL Grants Program

The 2020-21 Community Support Levy Grants Round provided funding of \$301 031 (ex-GST) for charitable organisations to undertake 28 community projects.

The Community Support Levy (CSL) is drawn from the profits of electronic gaming machines (pokies) in hotels and clubs. Part of the CSL is distributed back into the community through the CSL Charitable Organisations Grants Program. The CSL Grants Program provides grass roots community organisations with opportunities to access funding for equipment or projects which will benefit vulnerable groups.

The theme of the 2020-21 CSL Grants Round was social support. In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020-21 CSL Grants Round concentrated on social support as a critical component of health and wellbeing, in particular, social connectedness and social inclusion.

Two categories of funding were available:

- Small Equipment grants of up to \$5 000 (ex-GST) to enable organisations to add value to their services through the purchase of small equipment such as furniture, IT equipment and tools.
- Community Project grants of up to \$25 000 (ex-GST) to enable organisations to enhance the wellbeing of vulnerable individuals, families and communities.

After assessment, 28 grants were funded for a total of \$301 031 consisting of:

- 16 Small Equipment grants for \$50 075
- 12 Community Project grants for \$250 956.
