We wanted to thank you deeply for your contribution to the success of the Minderoo Foundation Annual Report launch in Hobart on Friday 29 November.

It was terrific to spend time with you over the morning. We got a lot out of your comments and we are inspired by your leadership on several fronts. Your Waste Action Plan, including the proposition of "100% reusable, recyclable or compostable by 2025" is bold. We were impressed by Tasmania's leadership in the arts and enjoyed a visit to Mona, kindly hosted by Mark Wilsdon, David Walsh and Kirsha Kaechele. We left inspired to collaborate.

We are heartened that you share our views on the importance of investment in early childhood, which is a topic of national opportunity. Our team had a terrific conversation with the Commissioner for Children and Young People, Leanne McLean and learned of the early results in your wellbeing program, which is similar to our early childhood education program in WA. We look forward to connecting further to share insights.

We believe early childhood will be well served on the forthcoming COAG agenda, specifically to drive the adoption of models like these - integrated and co-located early childhood services, with targeted support for vulnerable families from conception to 4 years. We look forward to supporting you in driving this.

Importantly, as we also discussed, it is critical the Government undertake the Regulatory Impact Assessment (RiA) of proposed T21 laws over the next three months in preparation for a second reading of the T21 Bill in May 2020.

As part of our visit we committed to bring forward the delivery of the Menzies Institute research to align with this timing, which we have done. Preliminary findings are now expected in April 2020. As such, we would like you Premier to support the timely completion of the RIA with the Treasurer, so that the Bill may be considered and ultimately supported by your Government with the aid of these two valuable inputs. This is in addition of course to the overwhelming public support of T21 from public health professionals and 78% of Tasmanians. We strongly believe that now is the time to act.

RE: Tobacco21 Regulatory Impact Assessment

Dear Premier.

I very much enjoyed catching up last month and appreciate your support regarding further tobacco control in your State.

I trust your Cabinet meeting went well on Tuesday, however, I have been informed that the Regulatory Impact Assessment (RIA) for Tobacco21 was not discussed.

At a time when the Royal Hobart and Launceston General remain under significant patient demand pressure for Emergency Department and Inpatient care, I cannot think what would be more of a pressing matter than smoking, the biggest contributor to disease and death in Tasmania.

I am disappointed that the Tobacco21 RIA was not approved at Tuesday's meeting, and my question to you is when will it be considered? You have the second highest smoking rates in the country – this is the everyday reality for many of your citizens.

New policy is essential for the health and wellbeing of Tasmanians, both of which we know are severely impacted by the crippling addiction of nicotine.

Economic security is also essential for the Tasmanian business community and of great importance to the small business and retail sectors. Undertaking the RIA during the first quarter of 2020, alongside the Menzies Institute report, is necessary for the Bill to be seriously considered by the Parliament in the second guarter of 2020.

Premier, I am requesting that your Government undertake a Regulatory Impact Assessment for Tobacco21, a policy first raised by your health portfolio.

Not doing so makes me further question the political influence of the tobacco industry in Tasmania.

I encourage that the RIA is committed to by the year's end so there is no ambiguity in your Government's priorities for 2020.

Dear Mr Formest

I understand you met with the former Premier, Will Hodgman in November as part of the Minderoo Foundation national roadshow. Thank you for your follow-up letter of 19 December 2019, in regards to Tobacco 21 and a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS). I am responding to you as Minister for Mental Health and Wellbeing. I also note the email from Bruce Mansfield on 24 December 2019, on the United States decision to raise the minimum age to purchase cigarettes, e-cigarettes and other tobacco.

Since you wrote, my Chief of Staff has been in touch with the Member for Windermere to clear up some confusion around the process of undertaking a Regulatory Impact Statement, and discuss a way forward.

On the matter of a Regulatory Impact Statement this is not something that is considered by Cabinet, it is part of the normal legislative process and would occur as part of any legislative change. To do so outside of the regular process would be highly unusual and costly.

I understand the Menzies Institute is undertaking a research project into tobacco use and T21. As Mr Dean has been advised, I would be most interested in seeing the research outcomes, which could become the impetus for the Government to revisit T21 and any new Motion tabled.

Reducing the smoking rate among Tasmanians is important and a key initiative of our Government's Health Tasmania Strategic Plan. This has helped guide a number of initiatives including – increasing the licence to sell tobacco from \$370.45 to \$1 111.35 from 1 January, 2018 and changed the Public Health Act to regulate the sale, use and display of e-cigarettes, increased the penalties for tobacco supply to minors and introduced 'fit and proper' checks for tobacco seller licence holders.

However, I agree that more has to be done to address this growing health issue and its impact on the Tasmanian Health system and broader economy. Tasmania's higher than national average smoking rates are not good, nor reflective of where I want this state's health to be headed in 2020.

We remain committed to considering additional ways we can reduce Tasmania's smoking rate.
