(1 October 2025 – 31 March 2026)

Ministerial & Electorate Office refurbishment/fit-out expenses

When elected, each Member of Parliament is entitled to an electorate office. Generally, works occur to electoral offices when there is a relocation to new premises and the tenancy is made fit-for-purpose. Expenditure may also occur where offices have been co-located into a single tenancy and minor works may be required to make the space fit-for-purpose, or to provide increased security measures and improve accessibility.

Each new refurbishment/fit-out undergoes a needs-based assessment by the Property Manager (usually the Manager of Properties and Procurement in the Department of Premier and Cabinet), who considers the associated energy footprint, cost, potential savings, and business needs.

The expenditure below includes Ministerial and Electorate Office refurbishment/fit-out expenses for the six-month period from **1 October 2025 – 31 March 2026**.
