Table 1 below shows the demographic profiles of various gambling groups.

- The proportion of males is higher among 'at risk' and problem gamblers.
- The 'at risk' group has the highest proportion of 18 24 year olds.
- The 'at risk' group has the highest proportion of people in part-time employment.
- The average income of the 'at risk' and problem gamblers is somewhat lower than that of non-gamblers and 'not at risk' gamblers.
