The main job of the **Senior Practitioner** is to protect your rights if you have restrictions placed on you.

A restriction is when someone stops you from doing what you want to do such as

- a locked fridge in your house
- a locked front door.

Support workers must tell the Senior Practitioner if they are using restrictions on you.





What else the Senior Practitioner does





Tells people about the best ways to support you if you use behaviours of concern

Behaviours of concern are when you do things that hurt yourself, hurt another person or break things

Gives advice about how to improve support to you





Tells people about how to protect your rights

The Senior Practitioner can check if your rights are protected.

They can:

- Visit where you live and talk to you
- Talk to anyone who might be using restrictions.

The Senior Practitioner can answer questions about restrictions.



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
