Family Violence Event Endorsement

- Family violence does not discriminate – it occurs across cultures, ages and economic status.
- The statistics make for difficult reading – since the age of 15, 17 per cent of women across Australia have experienced physical and/or sexual violence from a current or former intimate partner.

- And almost a quarter of women have experienced emotional abuse by a current or former partner.
- Exposure to family violence affects a child's development and there is increased vulnerability for later mental health problems. Exposure to family violence impacts children's future relationships.
- Family violence is the leading cause of homelessness for women and children.
- Reports to Tasmania Police by those experiencing family violence continue to increase. This reflects increased awareness of what constitutes family violence, as well as greater trust in our systems to support victim-survivors and hold perpetrators to account.
- Our vision is that all Tasmanians are safe, equal and respected, and that our homes, families and communities are free from all forms of family and sexual violence.
- On the 6th of September I met with the Prime Minister, and other first ministers, and we agreed on further steps to accelerate action to end gender-based violence in a generation and to deliver on the National Plan to End Violence against Women and Children. This includes:
 - Innovative approaches to better identify and respond to high risk perpetrators to stop violence escalating;

- Working with men, including men's behaviour change programs for perpetrators of gendered violence; and
 - Delivering much-needed support for frontline specialist and legal services

- We can, and must, do more as men in positions of influence. And that is what today is about.
- I encourage you to participate in today's workshop. And to think about what more you can actively do as a leader in the public service; or in your community, your sporting club or in your family.

- I'll leave you with the opening words from victim survivors from the 2023 National Plan:

‘Abuse and violence is a problem for victims, but it is not the victims’ problem. Genuine change begins with a willingness to listen. We must stop protecting perpetrators with our silence, and through inaction. We must sit in discomfort. It is time to be brave.’

- Thank you for being here, to listen, to learn and to be part of an uncomfortable conversation that we all need to have.

- And I want to especially thank Sarah Bolt, Tasmania's Anti-Discrimination Commissioner – whose final day it is in that role).
- And the organising committee Robert Blackwood, Rebecca Davis, Ross Smith and Wayne Johnson.
- Family violence does not discriminate – it occurs across cultures, ages and economic status.
- And the statistics make for difficult reading – since the age of 15, around 17 per cent of women across Australia have experienced physical and/or sexual violence from a current or former intimate partner.
- Almost a quarter of women have experienced emotional abuse by a current or former partner.
- And tragically, 46 women have died due to violence in 2024 alone.
- But behind every one of these statistics are hurt people – women of all ages, their children, their families, sisters, brothers, parents, grandparents.
- Family violence touches nearly everyone in our communities.
- It affects a child's development and exposes them to increased vulnerability for later mental health problems.

- It is the leading cause of homelessness for women and children.
- It breaks families and it can tragically mean death and lasting sorrow for far too many.
- Here in Tasmania, reports to Tasmania Police by those experiencing family violence continue to increase.
- While in some ways that is a good thing – reflecting an increased awareness of what is family violence, or perhaps a greater trust in our systems to come forward, report this crime and enable us to support victims and hold perpetrators to account.
- But on the other hand, it shows that this insidious violence in our communities – this *culture* of violence – is ever present, and we cannot afford complacency in any way.
- We must always be looking at new ways to stop this violence, to change this culture, to stand up together as one to say “enough”.
- My vision – our government’s vision – is for all Tasmanians to be safe, equal and respected, and that our homes, families and communities are free from all forms of family and sexual violence.
- It’s why we’ve prioritised family (and sexual) violence since we came into government ten years ago.

- It's why we'll continue to prioritise it.

Guidance notes

- The Premier and Attorney-General have been invited to open and close, respectively, the Parliamentary family violence event titled *Sex, Violence and Murder: the uncomfortable conversation that we have to have*.
- The Department of Premier and Cabinet understands that the Tasmanian Anti-Discrimination Commissioner, Sarah Bolt, has initiated this male-only event aimed at senior leaders in the Tasmanian State Service to highlight the role men can play in preventing family violence. Representatives from the Department of Justice and Tasmania Police have assisted in organising the event.
- Sue and Lloyd Clarke, the parents and grandparents of Hannah Clarke and her three children Aaliyah, Laianah and Trey, who lost their lives through domestic violence, are speaking at the event, along with anti-violence and life skills educator Michael Jeh. The event will be facilitated by Dr Simon Longstaff, Executive Director of The Ethics Centre.

Background

Small Steps 4 Hannah

- Hannah Clarke and her three children, Aaliyah, 6, Laianah, 4, and Trey, 3, lost their lives as a result of domestic violence on 19 February 2020.
- The Clarke Family established Small Steps 4 Hannah to raise awareness and educate children and young people to identify coercive control behaviours and H.A.L.T. (named from the first initials of Hannah and her children) the cycle of domestic and family Violence.
- Small Steps 4 Hannah makes distributions to eligible entities that provide intervention strategies and programs to prevent domestic violence in Australia, as well as supporting services for persons who have experienced or are at risk of coercive control and domestic violence.
- Small Steps 4 Hannah are training Tasmania Police on recognising coercive control.

Tasmania's Third Family and Sexual Violence Action Plan: Survivors at the Centre 2022-27

- *Tasmania's Third Family and Sexual Violence Action Plan: Survivors at the Centre 2022-27* (Survivors at the Centre) reaffirms the Government's long-term commitment to eliminate family and sexual violence in the Tasmanian community.
- This builds on the achievements under two previous action plans:
 - *Safe Homes, Safe Families: Tasmania's Family Violence Action Plan 2015-20*
 - *Safe Homes, Families and Communities: Tasmania's action plan for family and sexual violence 2019-22*
- Survivors at the Centre outlines a vision where all Tasmanians are safe, equal and respected, and homes, families and communities are free from all forms of family and sexual violence.
- There is a commitment of over \$100 million over the five years of the Action Plan from 2022-27 to deliver actions preventing and responding to family and sexual violence and holding perpetrators to account.
- In addition, Tasmania has received over \$21 million in funding from the Australian Government through the Family, Domestic and Sexual Violence Responses 2021-27 National Partnership.
 - Following agreement at National Cabinet in September 2024, an extension from 2025-30 to the FDSV Responses is currently being negotiated between the Commonwealth and state and territory governments.

Tasmanian Family and Sexual Violence Data and Services

- The total number of family violence incidents along with family violence arguments and information reports continue to rise.
- In 2023-24, Tasmania Police recorded 5,353 family violence incidents, a fourteen per cent increase on 2022-23.
- In 2023-24, Tasmania Police recorded 3,019 family violence arguments and information reports, a ten per cent increase on the year 2022-23.
- Tasmania Police indicate that this trend suggests increased awareness and reduced tolerance within the community in relation to family violence, along with greater knowledge of the reporting avenues available.
- There are also increased reports of sexual violence. In 2023-24, Tasmania Police recorded 740 sexual assaults, which is a twenty-two per cent increase on 2022-23 which was 608.

Service demand

- In 2023-24, all family and sexual violence services reported an increase in the number and complexity of new referrals.
- These increases, coupled with recruitment and retention challenges, have impacted appointment availability, waitlists and placed pressures on organisations.

National data – intimate partner violence causing death

- The Australian Institute of Criminology's Intimate Partner Homicide Dashboard presents verified data on incidents of intimate partner (male or female) homicide perpetrated against a female.
- The Dashboard notes that there have been 15 female victims of intimate partner (male or female) homicide across Australia between 1 January and 30 June 2024, including one homicide in Tasmania
 - This represents cases where an offender has been charged with murder or manslaughter, the offender died prior to arrest and would have been charged or the incidence had other legal intervention.
 - There were 45 female victims in 2023.
- According to the Counting Dead Women Australia project, a project of Destroy the Joint, which records known deaths of women due to violence caused by any person in Australia
 - 46 women have died due to violence in 2024 as at 21 August
 - This is compared to 64 in the full 2023 year and 56 in the full 2022 year.
