Cenotaph Briefing Paper

Introduction

The Hobart Cenotaph has historic, cultural, and spiritual significance to the Tasmanian community, especially to returned service personnel and their Families. It has been the site of memorial services since 1919. It is the main war memorial in Tasmania. Next year marks the 100th anniversary of the completion of the Cenotaph in 1925. It is a prominent landmark and commands numerous important sight lines across Hobart.

The Cenotaph meets five of the seven criteria established by the *Historic Cultural Heritage Act 1995* for inclusion on the Tasmanian Heritage Register. Undoubtedly, it is of historic heritage significance. In his 2001 Conservation Assessment, Ian Terry noted.

"The Hobart Cenotaph is of historic heritage significance as it has special symbolic, spiritual, cultural, and social meaning for the entire Tasmanian community, in particular returned service people and their families. It is a place symbolic of national identity and sacrifice."

Heritage Significance

- The Tasmanian Heritage Register Datasheet (ID Number 7137) and the Hobart Cenotaph
 Conservation Assessment prepared by lan Terry for the Hobart City Council, document in detail the historic, cultural, and spiritual significance of the Cenotaph.
- The Cenotaph meets five of the seven criteria set out by the Historic Cultural Heritage Act 1995
 for inclusion on the Tasmanian Heritage Register.
- It demonstrates the participation and sacrifice of Tasmanians in conflicts around the world, on all our behalf.
- As noted by lan Terry in his 2001 Conservation Assessment it "has special symbolic, spiritual, cultural, and social meaning for the entire Tasmanian community..."
- Having been completed in 1925, it is Australia's oldest state war memorial.



 The Cenotaph was purposely sited to command important sight lines including down the Derwent River. No development should be permitted that obscures the Cenotaph from these sight lines.

Important Sight Lines (Sullivan Cove Planning Scheme S 32.3.8)

- From the Cenotaph toward the mouth of the Derwent River, including the flat river plane that extends to the horizon; and
- From the Cenotaph to the horizon of the natural amphitheatre, including the Wellington Range descending to the Mt Nelson Ridge, then to Porter Hill and down to the waterplane at Long Point, Lower Sandy Bay; and
- From the Cenotaph to St George's Church; and
- From the Cenotaph to Parliament House forecourt along Morrison Street; and
- The views across the Cove toward the Cenotaph, including from Macquarie Street, the forecourt
 of Princes Wharf No 1 Shed; the paddock between Princess Wharf No 1 Shed and the Institute
 for Marine and Antarctic Studies (IMAS), Runnymede Street and the open space at the Eastern
 end of the IMAS building; and
- The view of the sunrise from the grounds of the Cenotaph, especially on ANZAC Day; and
- To and from Sullivans Cove and Derwent River aligning NE/SW; and
- From the Royal Engineers Building to Kangaroo Bay; and
- Along the Key Public Space; and
- To and from the Key Public Space and Cove Floor to the Cenotaph; and
- To and from Davey Street and the entry to the Key Public Space.

AFL Team/Stadium

- The RSL has always fully supported Tasmania having its own AFL team.
- We are fully aware that the State has been waiting decades for such an opportunity and we are excited to see it happen.
- We are also mindful of the social and economic benefits an AFL team will bring as demonstrated by the Jack Jumpers and the positive benefit this has had in the community.
- The RSL fully supports a stadium that does NOT unreasonably impact the historic, cultural, and spiritual significance of the Hobart Cenotaph.

Mac Pt 1.0 Stadium

 The Government's 1.0 stadium proposal will dwarf a treasured monument, the oldest of all the State Cenotaphs.



- It will block critical views including down the Derwent River, across to St George's Church in Battery Point and to Parliament House and Princes Wharf No 1 Shed that were all a prerequisite in the Cenotaph's design.
- The continued lack of critical detail is of grave concern and great frustration to the RSL; our three questions have remained the same from day one.
- Very recently we were concerned to learn from the CEO of the Macquarie Point Development
 Corporation (MPDC) that it has proposed to locate the stadium less than 95 metres from the base
 of the Cenotaph. This is sadly what we always thought but were never told.
- The above disclosure came in the wake of RSL's further complaint to Ms. Beach after studying the comments from herself and the Architect following the announcement of their recent comments about the proposed design on the ABC.
- It is clear to us that the current plan will ignore heritage, cultural and spiritual significance of the Cenotaph and of the sight lines that were critical to the Cenotaph design and location in 1925, which are clearly laid out in the Sullivans Cove Planning Scheme 1997.
- The RSL is in no doubt that building Stadium 1.0 will destroy the historic, cultural, and spiritual significance of the Cenotaph.
- As custodians of such a sacred place we cannot stand by and do nothing.

Mac Pt 2.0 Stadium

- RSL Tasmania Board Members unanimously support Stadium 2.0 as proposed by the Stadium
 Precinct Consortia (SPC) because it has no direct negative effect on the Cenotaph.
- The designs that SPC have shared with us covered off our critical concerns.
- There is no unreasonable impact on the important sight lines that are critical to the Cenotaph's design and location.
- Furthermore, SPC's consideration of support services for the RSL presents an opportunity to
 inject funds into the statewide operations of the RSL as we endeavour to make Tasmania a place
 where Veterans and their families can thrive.

What can Parliament do?

- RSL Tasmania has lost trust and faith in the MPDC to protect the historic, cultural, and spiritual significance of the Cenotaph.
- Because of their insistence in building a bulky roofed stadium that will stand at least 45 to 55
 metres high virtually 'on top of' the Cenotaph at ground level.
- Even though there is an alternative option (Stadium 2.0) that can deliver an AFL standard stadium that is supported by RSL Tasmania and some of the wider Tasmanian community.



 So, we have no option other than to ask Parliament to legislate to protect the Cenotaph by disallowing developments that unreasonably impact its historic, cultural, and spiritual significance.

We don't take this decision lightly but have been left with no other alternative now that the
 Government has made it clear that it has instructed architects to design a stadium to be sited no

further than 95 metres from the Cenotaph.

We believe currently that a stadium that complies with the requirements in the AFL Agreement means that based on other stadiums around the world it will be an extremely tall structure between 45 and 55 meters high, unless of course they decided to dig down. Our understanding is

that the ground at the site will be capped, so this option is not possible.

Conclusion

RSL Tasmania thanks you in anticipation of your support to assist us in protecting this sacred monument. A monument that continues to express Tasmanian's thanks and appreciation to all those who have served our country with distinction.

As lan Terry put it, and let us be ever mindful that, "The site of the Hobart War Memorial was chosen specifically for its conspicuous location which would make it a focal point for the city and constantly remind its citizens of the debt it owed to war veterans."





Thank you for providing my office with a copy of RSL Tasmania's briefing paper in relation to the Mac Point Precinct development and the Hobart Cenotaph.

Firstly, as Minister for Veterans' Affairs, I want to acknowledge the importance of the Cenotaph as a place of remembrance for Tasmanian veterans. Tasmanians have a proud and distinguished history of military service, with over 17,500 veterans and ex-serving personnel living in the state. Our Government deeply respects our veterans and the sacrifices they made for the freedoms we enjoy.

The Tasmanian Planning Commission have appointed an independent panel of experts to undertake an assessment of the Mac Point Multipurpose Stadium. The assessment process will provide an opportunity for you to raise your concerns about the potential impact of the project on the Cenotaph. The Project of State Significance assessment process will include significant public consultation with key stakeholders, such as the RSL. RSL calls for legislative protection of historic Cenotaph

Hobart, Tasmania, June 13, 2024 – The Cenotaph, a site of immense historic, cultural, and spiritual significance for all Tasmanians — particularly veterans and current service personnel — faces a critical threat from the proposed Mac 1.0 stadium project.

This sacred monument, which has been the heart of memorial services since 1919 and will mark its centennial as Australia's oldest state war memorial next year, must be preserved.

TMAG historian and conservator lan Terry captured its importance in his Conservation Assessment prepared for the Hobart City Council: "It is a place symbolic of national identity and sacrifice," he wrote.

While the RSL wholeheartedly supports Tasmania having an AFL team, we strongly oppose the Government's current stadium proposal.

The proposed stadium would dwarf the strategically located Cenotaph and obstruct essential sightlines from the River Derwent to Battery Point, Parliament House, and Princes Wharf No 1. These sightlines, particularly during the dawning of the sun, are critical to the Cenotaph's significance and are protected under the Sullivans Cove Planning Scheme.

Despite our repeated representations to the Macquarie Point Development Corporation (MPDC), our concerns have been ignored. The planned location of Mac 1.0, less than 95m from the base of the Cenotaph, represents a profound disregard for our historic monument.

As a result, the RSL has lost all trust and faith in the MPDC's commitment to preserving and honouring the Cenotaph.

In response, we have taken decisive action by sending a briefing paper to all members of Parliament, urging the passage of special legislation to protect the Cenotaph.

We welcome the Greens' decision to introduce such legislation, drafted in consultation with the RSL and the broader community, before it is debated later this year.

To clarify, the RSL has always supported Tasmania having an AFL team and does not oppose the construction of a stadium near the Cenotaph, provided it does not unreasonably impact the monument's sightlines or its historical, cultural, and spiritual significance.

Today, we would respectfully ask that if the Government wants to build a stadium nearby to the Cenotaph it engages constructively with Stadium 2.0 and finalise an agreement that achieves a WIN-WIN outcome: the protection of the Cenotaph and a permanent new home for the Tassie Devils.

Dear Premier.

I write to remind you of the historic, cultural and spiritual significance of the Hobart Cenotaph to the Tasmanian community, especially to returned and current service personnel and their families.

The Cenotaph was purposely sited on vital ground in 1925 to command important sight lines. The sight lines to the Derwent Estuary, Battery Point and St Georges Church will be blocked by the stadium 1.0 plans that have been released publicly. These impacts cannot be avoided because of the height and bulk of the stadium. At 54m high and only 96m from the Cenotaph the stadium will dwarf the Cenotaph.

RSL Tasmania has been clear and steadfast from the start, it has always known the stadium would dominate the Cenotaph and we have always known it would destroy key sightlines. The RSL has been disrespected and misled at every turn, be that by State growth, MPDC or Cox Architecture, with the former telling us it would be no more than 40 meters high at our congress in 2023 and the latter stating only 6 weeks ago in a meeting with us that it would be six stories.

Premier Sir, the very essence of the Cenotaph is its sightlines, to destroy these sightlines is to desecrate, humiliate and play little more than lip service to our sacred place.

The Cenotaph is a sacred place. RSL Tasmania cannot and will not stand by and do nothing.

No development should be permitted that obscures the Cenotaph from these sight lines. Sight lines which have been rightly protected by the Sullivans Cove planning scheme for decades.

Premier, at the launch of the stadium 1.0 design, the Minister for Sport and Events, Nic Street pledged that the Tasmanian government "wouldn't be interested in building something that wasn't sympathetic to the Cenotaph."

RSL Tasmania now calls on you to honour that pledge. And in doing so to -

- To acknowledge that the MPDC stadium 1.0 design desecrates the Cenotaph.
- To acknowledge that the stadium 1.0 design destroys important sight lines currently protected by the Sullivans Cove planning scheme.
- To acknowledge that the height and bulk of stadium 1.0 situated in front of and so close to the Cenotaph will 'invade' the space and negatively impact its cultural and spiritual significance.



RSL Tasmania supports Tasmania having its own AFL team. We are mindful of the social and economic benefits it will bring. It is for that reason we have worked closely with the Stadium Precinct Consortia (SPC) over many months to get a design for stadium 2.0 that we can endorse. I am pleased to confirm that stadium 2.0 has our support.

We are aware the SPC has lodged a formal submission with the government that is fully costed and fully funded. We ask you to adopt this proposal and abandon any further consideration of stadium 1.0.

Finally, we ask that you agree to meet with our President and myself at your earliest convenience, so that we can present our concerns in person to you.

"Undoubtedly, it is of great historic heritage significance, marking the service and sacrifice of Tasmanians in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations around the world over more than a century.

"It was purposely sited to command important sightlines across the city and down the Derwent River and many of these would be destroyed and the Cenotaph dwarfed by Stadium 1.0."

RSL Tasmania CEO John Hardy has <u>written to Premier Jeremy Rockliff</u> pointing out that the construction of the stadium would "desecrate, humiliate and play little more than lip service to our sacred place."

He urged the government to move the proposed stadium.

"RSL Australia encourages the government to consult with RSL Tasmania and stands ready to work with the parliament to develop appropriate legislation to protect Tasmania's sacred monument to our war veterans and service personnel," he said.

"The national league supports the introduction of Tasmanian legislation similar to that applying in other states, to protect its sanctity and heritage.

Dear John and Michael

I would like to thank you for our productive meeting last Thursday and your correspondence regarding the impact of the proposed multipurpose stadium at Macquarie Point on the Cenotaph.

I appreciate the concerns you have raised about the cultural and spiritual significance of the Cenotaph to the Tasmanian community, especially our returned and current service personnel and their families.

As expressed at our meeting, the Government's preferred location for the multipurpose stadium—remains Macquarie Point. There are many reasons for this, including cost to taxpayers and environmental impact, which were carefully considered alongside the impact on the sightlines from the Cenotaph.

I understand that Macquarie Point Development Corporation is currently developing their submission for the Tasmanian Planning Commission. The guidelines that the Tasmanian Planning Commission prepared for the assessment of the multipurpose stadium as a Project of State Significance include consideration of the sightlines as set out in the Sullivans Cove Planning Scheme, and these will form part of the assessment process.

I have also asked the Minister for Veterans' Affair, Hon Guy Barnett MP, and the Macquarie Point Development Corporation to work with you to try to lessen this impact through design improvements and possible enhancements to the Cenotaph.

Having listened carefully to the RSL's concerns, I acknowledge that the Government and the RSL may never agree on the preferred location for the multipurpose stadium. Notwithstanding this, I remain absolutely committed to ensuring that, should the Tasmanian Parliament approve the multipurpose stadium, it is designed and delivered in a way that benefits, honours, and respects our returned and current service personnel and their families.

One way to achieve this could be through the development of a Good Neighbour Agreement. I have no predetermined view on what this Agreement could contain but I know that my Minister Barnett is eager to work with you over the coming weeks and months.

If the RSL was open to this, I will ensure that Macquarie Point Development Corporation, Cox Architects, and all relevant State Government agencies are available to work with you and the Minister on your ideas and recommendations.

I do not expect that this Agreement will alter the RSL's position on the location for the multipurpose stadium. I respect your position and the returned and current service personnel who share this view.

What I do want to ensure is that the opportunities presented through this project, are used to benefit our Veterans, and honor and respect their service and sacrifice.

I look forward to continuing to engage with you on this important issue.


